100-BED HOSPITAL TO BE BUILT BY NUNS

***Order Lets Contract for \$175,-
000 Structure in Edgecombe Av.
to Honor Mother Cabrini.***

The Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart announced yesterday that contracts had been let for the construction of a 100-bed hospital on the block front on Edgecombe Avenue between 163d Street and 164th Street, overlooking High-bridge Park.

The hospital will be known as the Mother Cabrini Memorial Hospital in honor of Mother Frances Xavier Cabrini, who founded the order more than fifty years ago and who, before she died in Chicago, in 1917, had founded 100 hospitals, convents, orphanages, schools and homes for the aged in the United States and other countries.

The Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart operate both the Columbus Hospital at 227 East Nineteenth Street and Columbus Hospital Extension at 457 West 163d Street. The new structure will adjoin the Extension, more than double its capacity and modernize its service.

The building will be of Italian Renaissance architecture and will be situated in the center of a large plot landscaped with evergreen shrubs and a sunken garden. Construction will start soon and the laying of the cornerstone is planned for May. The building will cost \$175,000.
