FRED C. LEMMERMAN, BANKER IN QUEENS, 53

Fred C. Lemmerman, Queens banker and civic leader and formerly an operating builder in that borough for many years, died last night just after he had introduced a speaker at a meeting of the trustees of the Wyckoff Heights Hospital in the hospital's building in Brooklyn. His age was 53.

Mr. Lemmerman, who was a trustee of the hospital, resided in the Mowbray Apartments, 82-67 Austin Street, Kew Gardens, Queens, one of many large apartment buildings erected in Queens by Gross & Lemmerman, Inc., with which he was associated until two years ago. At his death he was executive vice president of the Ridgewood Savings Bank in Queens.

A veteran of the first World War, during which he was a member of the Ninth Regiment of the New York National Guard, Mr. Lemmerman served during the second World War as Queens chairman of several Treasury Department War Loan campaigns. He also was on his local ration board.

He was a member of the Triborough Bridge Authority in 1933, and was president of the Queensboro Chamber of Commerce in 1930 and 1931.

Surviving are his widow, Mrs. Mabel Lemmerman; his mother, Mrs. Anna Lemmerman, and a son, Edward J. Lemmerman.
